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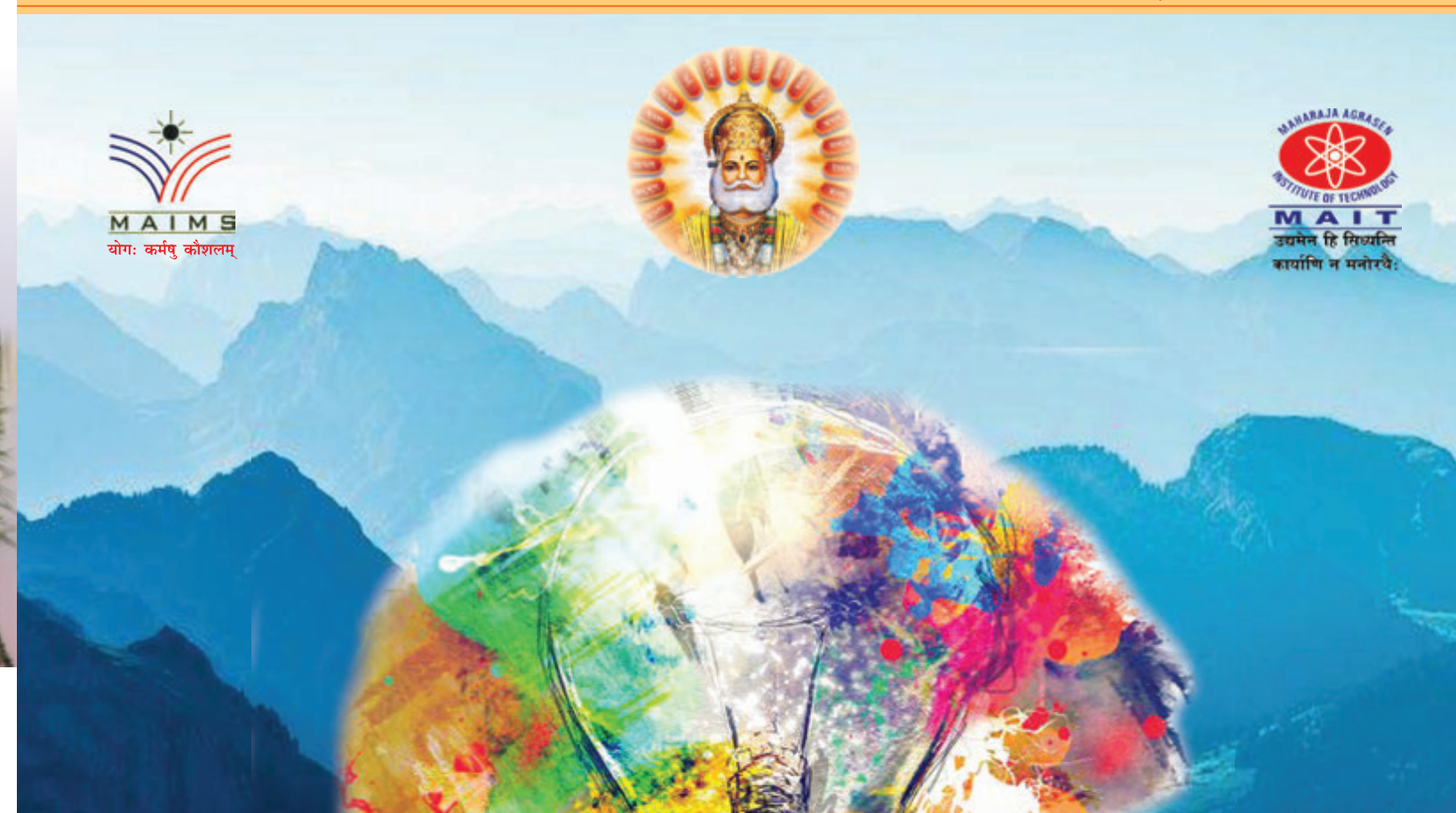

संस्थापक की कलम से

देश के लिए जीने का संकल्प

महाराजा अग्रसेन इंस्टीट्यूट ऑफ टेक्नोलॉजी के 21वें एवं महाराजा अग्रसेन इंस्टीट्यूट ऑफ मैनेजमेंट स्टडीज के 17वें वार्षिकोत्सव पर सभी विद्यार्थियों, शिक्षकों एवं कर्मचारियों को हार्दिक बधाई। आज से 22 वर्ष पहले जब महाराजा अग्रसेन टेक्निकल एजुकेशन सोसायटी का गठन किया गया था तो उसके पीछे एक मात्र उद्देश्य महाराजा अग्रसेन के आदर्शों एवं सिद्धान्तों के अनुरूप देश के लिए कुछ करने की भावना थी। मुझे यह देखकर हार्दिक प्रसन्नता होती है कि सोसायटी द्वारा संचालित यह दोनों संस्थान आज देश को न केवल योग्य वरन् चरित्रवान एवं देश प्रेम की भावना से ओत-प्रोत नागरिक प्रदान करने के लक्ष्य को प्राप्त करने में काफी सीमा तक सफल रहे हैं। सरकारी संस्थानों पर हो रहे खर्च के पाँचवें हिस्से की बराबर लागत पर यह दोनों संस्थान राष्ट्र को बेहतरीन मानव संसाधन प्रदान करने में सफल रहे हैं। उदाहरण के लिए जवाहर लाल नेहरू विश्वविद्यालय के संचालन पर सरकार द्वारा प्रत्येक वर्ष लगभग 600 करोड़ रुपये खर्च किए जाते हैं एवं वहाँ पढ़ने वाले विद्यार्थियों की संख्या 8000 के आस-पास है। मेट एवं मेम्स के अलावा महाराजा अग्रसेन विश्वविद्यालय में पढ़ने वाले कुल विद्यार्थियों की संख्या भी लगभग 8000 के आस-पास है। जबकि हमारी कुल लागत लगभग 100 करोड़ वार्षिक के आस-पास है। इसलिए आज समय की मांग है कि समाज के सहयोग से चलने वाली शैक्षिक संस्थानों को निजी संस्थानों का दर्जा न देकर सरकार द्वारा एक तृतीय श्रेणी में रखा जाए एवं सरकार द्वारा उन्हें प्रोत्साहित किया जाए, ठीक उसी प्रकार जैसे सरकार डीएवी एवं सनातन धर्म जैसी संस्थानों को प्रोत्साहित करती है। वर्तमान में सरकार की नजर में औद्योगिक समूहों एवं पारिवारिक ट्रस्टों द्वारा संचालित शैक्षिक संस्थाओं को एक ही श्रेणी में रखते हुए समान व्यवहार किया जाता है। जबकि इसके निर्माण एवं संचालन के पीछे उद्देश्य पूरी तरह अलग है। ऐसी संस्थानों का उद्देश्य लाभ कमाना नहीं वरन् समाज के चारित्रिक एवं शैक्षणिक विकास में निस्वार्थ योगदान देना है। महाराजा अग्रसेन टेक्निकल एजुकेशन सोसायटी को सहयोग देने वाले लोगों की संख्या हजारों में है। ये वे लोग हैं जो अपनी कमाई का एक हिस्सा मानव कल्याण के कार्यों में लगाना अपना कर्तव्य समझते हैं एवं इसके माध्यम से होने वाले कार्यों को देखकर उनको संतोष प्राप्त होता है। इसके साथ ही साथ अनेकों उद्योगपति, बुद्धिजीवी, शिक्षाविद् एवं समाजसेवी भी हमारी संस्था में निस्वार्थ भाव से समय दे रहे हैं जिससे सोसायटी को मिलने वाले एक-एक पैसे का सदुपयोग होता है एवं विद्यार्थियों को बेहतरीन शैक्षिक एवं बौद्धिक पर्यावरण प्राप्त होता है जिससे उनके व्यक्तित्व का सर्वांगीण विकास हो रहा है। उनकी उपलब्धियों से न केवल घर परिवार एवं संस्थान को गौरव की अनुभूति होती है वरन् देश के विकास एवं मान-सम्मान में भी वृद्धि होती है। आज हमारे 1000 से ज्यादा विद्यार्थी जो अमेरिका में कार्यरत हैं लेकिन अपने देश की मिट्टी से जुड़े हुए हैं एवं देश के लिए कुछ करने का सपना उनके दिलों दिमाग में चलता रहता है। यह विद्यार्थी आज भी मेट एवं मेम्स के साथ भावनात्मक रूप से जुड़े हुए हैं। 100 से ज्यादा विद्यार्थी इस समय सेना में बतौर अफसर कार्यरत हैं। इसके अलावा उन विद्यार्थियों की संख्या भी काफी अधिक है जो आई.ए.एस., पी.सी.एस., डाक तार, आर.एफ.एस., पी.पी.एस. जैसी प्रतियोगी परीक्षाओं में सफलता प्राप्त कर महत्वपूर्ण पदों पर कार्य कर रहे हैं। हमारी सोसायटी आज एलकेजी से लेकर पीएचडी तक की शिक्षा प्रदान करने का कार्य कर रही है जिसका सपना इसके संस्थापक सदस्यों द्वारा आज से 22 वर्ष पहले देखा गया था।

पिछले दिनों कई अनुभवी उद्योगपति, शिक्षाविद् एवं बुद्धिजीवी सोसायटी के साथ जुड़े हैं जिनके सहयोग से हम अपनी सेवाओं की गुणवत्ता बढ़ाने में निश्चित रूप से सफल होंगे। प्रतिष्ठित उद्योगपति विनीत कुमार लोहिया हमारी सोसायटी के संस्थापक सदस्यों में से एक हैं जिन्होंने सोसायटी के अध्यक्ष पद का दायित्व स्वीकार किया है। सेवानिवृत्त आईएएस एसपी अग्रवाल को कार्यकारी अध्यक्ष का दायित्व प्रदान किया गया है। दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के एक प्रतिष्ठित कॉलेज में लम्बे समय तक प्राचार्य का कुशलतापूर्वक भार वहन करने वाले प्रो. एसके गर्ग को महानिदेशक का दायित्व प्रदान किया गया है। मेट के पूर्व निदेशक एमएल गोयल को सोसायटी के वाइस चेयरमैन का दायित्व प्रदान किया गया है। रिटायर्ड बैंकर रजनीश गुप्ता एवं अविनाश अग्रवाल को सचिव का कार्यभार प्रदान किया गया है। मुझे आशा ही नहीं पूर्ण विश्वास है कि हमारी टीम में इन महानुभावों के जुड़ने से संस्थानों की प्रगति और लोकप्रियता में और वृद्धि होगी। पिछले वर्ष हमें अपने अध्यक्ष श्री प्रेम सागर गोयल जी के आकस्मिक निधन के कारण बड़े आघात का सामना करना पड़ा। उनके नेतृत्व में सोसायटी ने तेजी से प्रगति की एवं सोसायटी द्वारा अपने संस्थानों के रचनात्मक ढाँचे को विकसित करने की दिशा में महत्वपूर्ण कदम उठाए गए। स्व. गोयल जी के नेतृत्व में ही मेट और मेम्स परिसर में सत्या अग्रवाल नाम के ब्लॉक का शिलान्यास किया। इस ब्लॉक के तहत एक लाख वर्ग फुट एरिया का निर्माण किया जाएगा जिस पर 20 करोड़ लागत आने की संभावना है। सोसायटी द्वारा इस ब्लॉक का निर्माण 2022 तक पूरा करने का लक्ष्य निर्धारित किया गया है। इस ब्लॉक का निर्माण होने से हमारी प्रवेश क्षमता बढ़ेगी एवं हम और ज्यादा विद्यार्थियों को शिक्षित करने में सक्षम हो सकेंगे। आपको यह जानकर हार्दिक प्रसन्नता होगी कि बी.टेक के चतुर्थ वर्ष में ही हमारे 27 विद्यार्थियों को विभिन्न कंपनियों में 10 लाख रुपये से ज्यादा के पैकेज वाले नियुक्ति पद प्राप्त हो चुके हैं। सीएसई के दो छात्रों स्वाति सिंह एवं अमन कुमार को माइक्रोसॉफ्ट की ओर से 43 लाख रुपये के पैकेज पर नियुक्ति पत्र मिले हैं। इसके अलावा भी 30 लाख, 27 लाख, 17 लाख के पैकेज पर भी नियुक्ति पत्र पाने वाले छात्रों की संख्या प्रशंसनीय है। मुझे पूरा विश्वास है कि हमारे संस्थान से डिग्री प्राप्त करने से पहले ही सभी छात्रों के हाथ में सम्मानजनक पैकेज पर नियुक्ति पत्र होंगे क्योंकि यहाँ से निकलने वाले छात्रों को कभी भी नौकरी की तलाश के लिए भटकना नहीं पड़ता।

नागरिकता संशोधन कानून



भारत सरकार द्वारा नागरिकता संशोधन कानून बनाने के बाद राजधानी दिल्ली सहित देश भर में अनेक स्थानों पर विरोध-प्रदर्शन आरम्भ हो गया। विभिन्न समूहों द्वारा यह भ्रम फैलाया जाने लगा

की यह अधिनियम देश के मुस्लिम समुदाय के साथ भेदभाव करता है तथा संविधान विरोधी है। निरंतर यह भी भ्रामक प्रचार किया जा रहा है कि इस अधिनियम के साथ-साथ राष्ट्रीय नागरिकता कानून भी लाया जा रहा है जो मुस्लिम विरोधी है। इस भ्रामक प्रचार के कारण देश भर में हिंसक प्रदर्शन आरम्भ हो गए जिससे भारी सार्वजनिक क्षति हुई।

वास्तविक स्थिति यह है कि नागरिकता संशोधन कानून से किसी भी भारतीय नागरिक को कोई लेना देना नहीं है चाहे वह किसी भी मत पंथ को मानते हो। यह कानून भारत की उस उदात्त परंपरा के अनुसार जो शताब्दियों से पीड़ितों और असहायों को अपने यहाँ आश्रय देती रही है, की अगली कड़ी है। अलग-अलग समय पर अपने-अपने देशों में सताए जा रहे या अपने देश से विस्थापित लोगों को भारत में शरण मिलती रही है। स्वतंत्रता के बाद 1955 में नागरिकता अधिनियम लाया गया जिसके अंतर्गत भारत के नागरिक होने की कुछ शर्तें तय की गयीं। उसके बाद अलग-अलग समय पर अलग-अलग शरणार्थी समूहों को नागरिकता प्रदान की गई। वर्तमान नागरिकता संशोधन कानून पाकिस्तान, बांग्लादेश और अफगानिस्तान के ऐसे अल्पसंख्यकों को नागरिकता प्रदान करता है जिनको अपने देशों में अपने पार्थिक आस्था के कारण भारी अत्याचार सहना पड़ रहा था। उनका दमन उनके देशों की दमनकारी नीतियों तथा वहाँ की बहुसंख्यक आबादी द्वारा निर्ममता पूर्वक निरंतर किया जाता रहा आत्मरक्षार्थ जिस कारण उन लोगों ने भारत में शरण ली हुई थी। पाकिस्तान में अल्पसंख्यकों के दमन का इतिहास उसके अस्तित्व में आने जितना ही प्राचीन है। पाकिस्तान के प्रमुख संस्थापकों में से एक जोगेंद्र नाथ मंडल जो वहाँ के प्रथम कानून और श्रम मंत्री भी थे पाकिस्तान में अल्पसंख्यकों पर हो रहे अमानवीय अत्याचारों के कारण केवल चार वर्षों में ही वहाँ से भारत वापस आ गए थे। उन्होंने पाकिस्तान में अल्पसंख्यकों पर हो रहे अमानवीय अत्याचारों पर विस्तार से लिखा था। यह जोगेंद्र नाथ मंडल ही थे जिनके कारण असम का अभिन्न अंग सिलहट पाकिस्तान का भाग बना जो आज बांग्लादेश का भाग है। उन्हीं के प्रभाव के कारण सिलहट के हिन्दुओं ने मुस्लिम लीग का समर्थन किया और पाकिस्तान के पक्ष में

अपना मत दिया। जोगेंद्र नाथ मंडल को पाकिस्तान के समर्थन का पछतावा जीवन भर रहा और गुमनामी में ही उनका शेष जीवन बीता। नागरिकता संशोधन कानून का मुख्य उद्देश्य पाकिस्तान, बांग्लादेश और अफगानिस्तान से आने वाले 6 समुदायों (हिन्दू, सिख, बौद्ध, पारसी, जैन और इसाई) के शरणार्थियों को भारत की नागरिकता देना है जो कि दिसंबर 31, 2014 को या इससे पहले उत्पीड़न का शिकार होकर भारत आये थे। इनमें से अधिकांश शरणार्थी वीजा लेकर भारत आये थे परन्तु वापस नहीं गये। ये लोग घुसपैठिये नहीं थे बल्कि प्रताड़ना के शिकार होकर भारत आये थे, जिनमें से अधिकांश गुजरात, राजस्थान और दिल्ली में रह रहे हैं। वर्तमान राजग सरकार के कार्यकाल में भी हजारों मुस्लिमों को भारत की नागरिकता दी गयी है जिसमें प्रख्यात गायक अदनान सामी जैसे लोग भी शामिल हैं। प्रख्यात लेखिका तसलीमा नसरीन ने भी कई वर्षों से इस्लामिक कट्टरपंथ का शिकार होकर भारत में शरण ली हुई है। बांग्लादेश की वर्तमान प्रधानमंत्री शेख हसीना ने भी कई वर्षों तक भारत में शरण ले रखी थी। समावेशी संस्कार और सहिष्णुता भारतीय जीवन दर्शन के मूल में हैं। वसुधैव कुटुम्बकम् की अवधारणा भारत की ही देन है। भारतीय ऋषियों ने ही 'माता भूमि पुत्रोऽहम् पृथिवयाः' का प्रतिपादन किया था। इसलिए इस विरोध का औचित्य क्या है?

भारत सरकार के इस स्वागत योग्य कदम के बावजूद भ्रामक प्रचार के कारण देश के नागरिकों के कुछ हिस्सों में निर्मूल आशंकाओं का बीजारोपण विभिन्न समूहों द्वारा निरंतर किया जा रहा है। सरकार को इस पर त्वरित कार्यवाही करते हुए अपने तंत्र के द्वारा उन सभी लोगों के समूहों जिनके मन में इसको लेकर कोई आशंका है, से संवाद स्थापित करना चाहिए और उनको इस कानून की वास्तविक स्थिति से परिचित कराना चाहिए।

पूर्वोत्तर के राज्यों में भी इस कानून का विरोध हो रहा है। उनकी आशंका है की बांग्लादेश से आये हुए शरणार्थियों की एक बड़ी संख्या जो पूर्वोत्तर के राज्यों में है, उनको वही की नागरिकता दे दी जायेगी और इस प्रकार पूर्वोत्तर के राज्यों की मूल संस्कृति इससे प्रभावित होगी। सरकार को पूर्वोत्तर के राज्यों से भी बेहतर संवाद स्थापित करना चाहिए, उनकी आशंकाओं का विशेष ध्यान रखना चाहिए। सरकार को इन तीनों देशों से आये हुए शरणार्थियों को सघन आबादी वाले क्षेत्रों के बजाय उनको देश के विरल आबादी वाले क्षेत्रों में बसने की व्यवस्था करनी चाहिए जिससे देश के नागरिकों में किसी भी प्रकार के असंतोष की भावना नहीं पनपे।

Intelligent Greenhouse System

It will monitor the temperature, moisture, humidity and sunlight received by the plant and turn on fan, motor pump and light bulb accordingly to keep the plant in an optimal condition.

We have recorded the data provided by the sensors and prepared a dataset which is used to predict future values of environmental variables using linear regression algorithms.

So with a large enough dataset we can predict the nature of the plant's requirements without the use of any sensors.

The data acquired is used in real time to improve the accuracy of the sensors as well as to expand the dataset.

When applied on a large scale the number of sensors deployed will reduce significantly as compared to a standard smart green house as the algorithm used would predict characteristics of the whole greenhouse by taking minimal input from the sensors.

This would help in reducing the amount of water consumed, electricity used as well as man-power required. ○

Team FALCON7@ led by ECE students gets First Prize in SMART INDIA Hackathon 2019

MHRD along with AICTE organised SMART INDIA HACKATHON 2019, as a 5 days hardware hackathon from 8th July to 12th July 2019, conducted in 19 nodal centre across India. Team FALCON7 from MAIT participated in the theme "Drone and Robotics",



where they developed a prototype for the problem statement 30 KG PAYLOAD CARRYING MULTIROTOR WITH A FLIGHT TIME OF 40-50 MINUTES, this problem statement was proposed by BHARAT FORGE LTD.

The team's idea was shortlisted from over 150 proposal and they won first prize at the grand finale, winning a cash prize of 1 lakh rupees. Team members:

About the Project

Team falcon 7 prototype was a multipurpose quadcopter named VIDYUT which can lift a payload of 1 kg with a

flight time of 25-30 minute autonomously with the help of GPS. Vidyut is equipped with highly sensitive air quality and gas leakage monitoring system. It can detect the level of particulate matter PM2.5 which will tell the quality of air in that particular area. The data collected can be recorded



and transmitted wirelessly over a network and monitored from a distance. It can also detect the amount of particular gases like Petroleum and natural gas. The quad can hover near the gas pipelines continuously measure the amount of gas and transmit it to monitoring station. If the value of gas exceeds from a safe amount it will immediately report it to the station and will tell the exact location of leakage using a GPS. Thus, preventing any major disaster.

For the finals, the team developed an octacopter capable of carrying a heavy payload of 30kg with a high endurance of 50minute. The octacopter has a unique design and revolutionary battery system which is one of a kind. ○

This year "AI-powered Surveillance Drone" developed by students of the ECE department, Sparsh Wadhwa and Tushar Gusain under the guidance of Mr. Hemant Tulsani won second place in this competition and was awarded in the ceremony.

Some Details about Project

Students have developed an A.I. Powered HexaCopter aimed at helping Delhi Police for surveillance purposes. The drone is equipped with all the necessary sensors to provide easy communication and location updates to the nearby police station. The drone is equipped with a camera that can record and stream 1080p HD Live videos to the operator's computer in the range of 3 Kms. The operator can operate the drone within the range of 1.5 Kms. It is easily deployable and maneuverable. It can be easily operated in the night time as well.

Further, we have designed a Deep Learning model for Human Activity Recognition, which can detect any unlawful/criminal activity in the streaming video in Real-Time and hence will notify the nearest police station about the same. Our Deep Learning model has achieved an accuracy of 76%, which means it is correct

76% of the time in detecting human activities. Notifications are sent via Google Cloud, which offers Real-Time updates. The nearest police station will get updated within microseconds.

Eligibility for the certificate will be announced on the course page and learners will get certificates only if this criteria is matched. Universities/Colleges approving credit transfer for these courses can use the marks/certificate obtained in these courses for the same. SWAYAM-NPTEL is the National MOOCs portal being developed by MHRD, Govt. of India. In order to ensure best quality content is produced and delivered, National Coordinator for Engineering. National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning is an initiative by seven Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT Bombay, Delhi, Guwahati, Kanpur, Kharagpur, Madras and Roorkee) and Indian Institute of Science (IISc) Bangalore for creating course web and video contents in various disciplines of engineering, basic science, management and humanities

This is done through a platform that facilitates hosting of all the courses, taught in classrooms from Class 9 till post-graduation to be accessed by anyone, anywhere at any time. All the courses are interactive, prepared by the best teachers in the country and are available, free of cost to any learner. More than 1,000 specially chosen faculty and teachers from across the country have participated in preparing these courses.

About SWAYAM:

The courses hosted on SWAYAM are in 4 quadrants - (1) Video lecture, (2) Specially prepared reading material that can be downloaded/printed (3) Self-assessment tests through tests and quizzes and (4) Online discussion forum for clearing the doubts. Steps have been taken to enrich the learning experience by using audio-video and multi-media and state of the art pedagogy / technology.

In order to ensure that best quality content is produced and delivered, nine National Coordinators have been appointed. They are:

1. AICTE (All India Council for Technical Education) for self-paced and international courses

2. NPTEL (National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning) for Engineering
3. UGC (University Grants Commission) for non technical post-graduation education
4. CEC (Consortium for Educational Communication) for under-graduate education

SWAYAM-NPTEL has been offering self-study courses across engineering, humanities and science streams for more than a decade. These are available at: <http://nptel.ac.in>. From March 2014 NPTEL has been offering online certification for its courses, the highlight being the certification exam through which the student gets an opportunity to earn a certificate from the IITs! These are available at: <https://swayam.gov.in/NPTEL>.

To take this initiative forward and to encourage more students across colleges to participate in this initiative, Prof. Neelam Sharma, Director, MAIT is setting up SWAYAM-NPTEL chapter in the college with the approval of the management. This course is being conducted with the help of Prof. Sunil Kumar HOD ECE Department MAIT, Prof. V.N.Mathur HOD MAE Department MAIT. This program will be under the headship of a faculty member of the college, who would be our Single Point of Contact (SPOC) Dr. Nitin Sharma, ECE Department. SPOC is updated about all the latest NPTEL initiatives and is given information which he can disseminate among the students. He can identify suitable mentors for various courses, who can ensure that students are active in a course, are submitting their assignments on time and also clarify the doubts they may have. We have received overwhelming response from the students for the same.

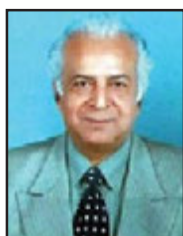

The Upnishadas-Perennial Wisdom

The Upnishadas are ancient treatises, written in Sanskrit, containing the theosophy of the Vedas. They are often referred to as rahasya, the mystery or secret, as being formerly taught only to those who had gone through a special preliminary training and given proof of their fitness; they are also called shruti-shirh or the “head of revelation” handed down to the Aryan inhabitants of India. The Vedas, as they exist today, consist of four great collections: Rig, Yajur, Sama and Athrva Vedas; the word Veda is interpreted as “knowledge” or “science”. Each collection is subdivided into three parts: mantra or hymns, brahmana or ceremonial codes; when they have fulfilled their duties and arnyaka or instructions for those who in olden times used to retire to the forest (aranya) to follow the religious life. The Upnishads generally belong to the last class who recite the hymns of all the nine Upnishadas:

1. Ishopanishad
2. Kenopanishad
3. Kathopanishad
4. Prashnopanishad
5. Mundkupanishad
6. Mandukyopanishad
7. Taittiriyanopanishad
8. Aitareyanopanishad
9. Shvetashvataropanishad

The Ishopanishad-The Argument

The Ishopanishad is so called from the first word of the text. It forms the last chapter of the later collection of the Yajurveda, called Shukla or White. The peace chant declares the identity or the universal Self and the individual self. Though all individual souls come from the Over-Soul, yet it remains undiminished. Harih is the name of the Supreme in his aspect of “destroyer” of sins. Om receives full explanation in the Mandukyopanishad.

The Upnishad begins by laying down the doctrine of action without attachment to result-vairagya (1,2).

What people slay the Self, is a poetical expression for those who are dead to the Self, for the Self is deathless and cannot be slain, (3)

The nature of the Self is described: it ever escapes the senses as life the scalpel of a biologist. (4, 5)

The state of one who knows this truth. (6,7)

The description of the Self continued (8)

The paths of unwisdom and wisdom lead respectively to the heaven of reward within the spheres of rebirth, and to the enjoyment of a state of existence beyond this sphere. These are characterised respectively as ‘blind darkness’ and even ‘greater darkness, as it were’ as compared to the true state of the Self; for in the one case, a man is still under the influence of desire; in the other, although he may enjoy an almost infinitely prolonged state of bliss as a god, nevertheless he has less chance of knowing the reality, which can only be known by one in the human state of existence. The crossing over death means crossing in safety over the dangerous intermediate state between earth-life and the heaven world, (9-14)

Next follows the invocation to the Self, addressed to the sun as the most glorious symbol of that Self in the sensible universe. “He who is there, that being there, He is myself”- tradition says that the devotees here pointed first to orb of the rising sun, and then to the sky overhead, thus signifying that the light of the sun and the light of his soul were both aspects of the supreme Light of all lights, Paramatman. (15,16)

The concluding mantras are for recitation at hour of death. The last thoughts of a man have a great directing force in his journey after death. Again it is the mind that carries over the remembrance of past births. By fixing the mind on this fact at the moment of death, the possibility of recollection in the next birth is strengthened, (17-18)

Om! To Brhman that is, all hail!

THE PEACE CHANT

Om! Whole is That, whole {too} is this.

From whole, whole cometh; take whole from
Whole, (yet) whole remains.

Om! PEACE, PEACE, PEACE! Harih, Om

God-ventured, Om! Must all this be, whatever chageth in the changing (world); renounce it then, delight [in Him]; nor covet {ought, for} whose is wealth. (1)

Here (on the earth) such deeds performing, a man should pass his hundred years; thus then for thee-there is no other way-doeth action not besmirch the man. (2)

Sunless they call those worlds, wrapped in blind darkness;

Aye, whose seeth all things in that Self, and Self is everything; from That he'll no more hide. (6)

He hath pervaded all, radiant and simple, spotless, pure, incorporate, by sin untainted. He, the seer, the lord of mind, the all embracer, self-existent; fitly hath He disposed the objects (of all things for everlasting ages. (8)

Into blind darkness do they plunge who bow before unwisdom; to (even) greater darkness, as it were, they (go) who yet again in wisdom find delight. (9)

One thing by wisdom they say, by unwisdom, say they another; thus have we heard from the wise, who gave instruction upon it. (10)

Who knoweth wisdom and unwisdom both, together with wisdom he crosseth over death, by wisdom immortality he reacheth, (11)

Into blind darkness do they plunge who bow before non-being; to [even] greater darkness, as it were, they [go] who yet again in being find delight. (12)

One thing by being they say, by non-being, say they another; thus have we heard from the wise, who gave us instruction upon it. (13)

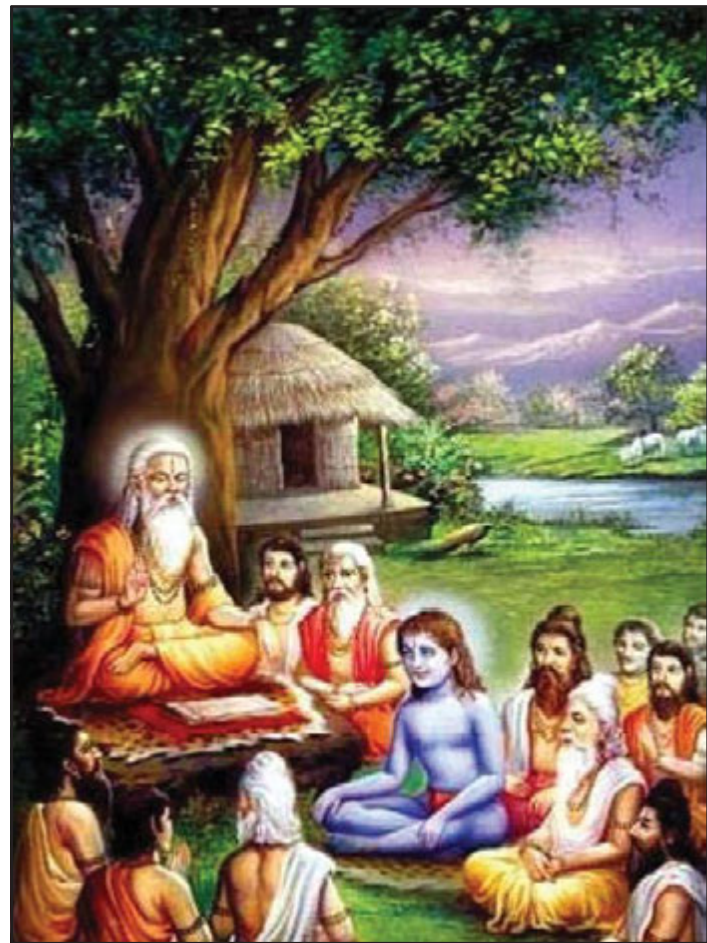
Who knoweth being and non-being both, together with non-being he crosseth over death, by being immortality he reacheth. (14)

Truth's face is hidden by a disk of gold. Unveil, O thou that nourishes [the world], that I the keeper of law of truth, may see [thy face]. (15)

All-fostering sun, sole seer [and] ordainer, child of creation's lord, marshall [thy] beams, thy light indraw! That form of thine, the loveliest of all; that I behold! He who is there, that being there. He is me. (16)

Breath to the deathless breath, to ashes may this body go! Om! Mind, [thy] deeds recall, recall, O mind, recall thy deeds, recall. (17)

O fire [divine] lead us by a fair path to our reward; O god



who knowest all our deeds, strip from us crooked evil! To thee all hail oft and again we cry! (18)

Thus, the Upanishad has ending

In all the hymns we find (as they are meant for Aranyakas) the emphasis is on all good deeds so that not only this life (Ih-Lok) but also you will find salvation in 'Life-Beyond' (Per-Lok).

Frequent prayers are there to save us from the crooked evil ways of the world so our deeds will be sublime.

Prayers are for both movable (char) and immovable (achar) beings. It exhibits the concepts of sustainable world where all beings are same in His eyes.

Prayers also exhibit the philosophy of (Advait) i.e. oneness with Supreme-Being after leaving this world. Wisdom and Good deeds are the guiding force to attain Salvation.

Case-1

On the worst day of the smoke, my college friend Shweta Aggarwal living in Australia since 2017 remembers watching ambulances rushing through the streets just outside her house in a single hour. Her first thought was, how many people are going to die. It was early January. The Australian capital saw days of poisonous air quality. And researchers say we don't yet know what the long-term health effects will be. The relationship between climate change, air pollution and human health is inextricable. According to the studies rising temperatures from climate change can increase air pollutants, such as ground level ozone. In recent years Australia has experienced more frequent bushfires and dust storms because of climate change. The most common air pollutants that are dangerous to human health are coarse and fine particulate matter (PM), nitrogen oxide, sulphur dioxide and carbon monoxide.

What could be done.....

1. Avoid the consumption of gases dangerous to the ozone layer
2. Minimize the use of cars
3. Do not use cleaning products that are harmful to the environment
4. Maintain air conditioners

Case-2

New Delhi stands at first place for having the world's worst air quality index. Delhi being the capital of India holds an important place on the map. Unfortunately for its citizens, New Delhi's

air is fatal and is deteriorating day by day. The statistics are alarming. Specific to New Delhi, the numbers of vehicles on the road have increased by sixty-five percent since 2003. The more vehicles on the road mean that there are more harmful pollutants which are being released into the atmosphere. Another main cause of Delhi's air pollution is whole lot of air-traffic passing through the city's atmosphere. Geography also plays a role in New Delhi's traumatic air pollution since it is surrounded by land from all sides. There is no coastal breeze which can help in eliminating the pollutants.



Environmentalists suggest that the government must focus on bringing down the number of vehicles on the road and strengthening the public transportation system. Schemes like 'Odd-Even', 'Smog-Tower' are small steps toward improvement, a lot more is needed to be done. The air needs to be restrained and it needs to be done now.

What could be done.....

3. alternative fuels for coal-fired plants to help reduce the harmful emissions coal gives off
4. strict environmental standards
5. More thoughtful use of Solar-energy

Life Below Water

Oceans cover three-fourth of the Earth's surface. Marine ecosystem provides food, employment, absorbs pollution and regulates the flood on land. Around 3 billion of 7.7 billion global populations depend on marine and coastal biodiversity for their alimentation [1]. The market value of marine and coastal resources is estimated at USD 3 trillion per year which is about 5% of Global GDP [1]. 90% of the world trade and 80% of the world's maritime oil trade is carried out through seas [2]. India being a coastal country with a shoreline of about 7,517 km in length has compelling interests in oceans which include fishing, tourism, exploration, security and trade. India's 13.36% population lives in coastal districts with approximately 250 million people depending on coastal biodiversity for their livelihood [1].

Other than economic aspects, oceans reduce the effects of industrialization by absorbing 40% of total carbon emissions every year [1]. According to a statement released by United Nations Development Program (UNDP) in 2019, tiny organisms called ocean plankton present in seas produce half of the oxygen on earth [3]. But unfortunately, the allure and endless benefits of marine souls are not enough to satisfy the avidity of humans.



Since industrialization is at peak in India, ocean bodies experience an inflow of tones of debris and plastic waste through rivers flowing from the mainland. India generates 25,000 tonnes plastic every day of which 40% remains uncollected [1]. A study in Nature Communications Journal ranked Ganges as the world's second-biggest contributor to plastic waste into oceans [4]. India is ranked 12th among the top 20 countries responsible for marine pollution [1]. Marine pollution costs more than \$ 7.9 billion in damage to marine ecosystems and kills around one million sea birds and 1,00,000 sea mammals. Other than plastic, unregulated and over-exploitation of fish-stocks is a serious concern for India. India is the second-largest producer of fish in the world [1]. Fishing employs a large population of India and is an important source of protein. Many Indian cultures are incomplete without fish like West Bengal, Orissa, and South Indian states. Think of a day with no fish in India! Sounds unrealistic but this may become reality if overexploitation continued at present rates.

80% of the world's fisheries are already exploited, depleted, or in a state of collapse [5]. According to live statistics of 'The World Counts', as on 21 January 2020, there were only 27 years 344 days left to the end of seafood [5]. This rapid depletion is causing ocean fisheries to generate USD 50 billion less per year globally [1]. At this time when India is trying to reach a value of USD 5 trillion GDP by 2025, this depletion is a serious threat. The big coastline makes it more crucial for India to take steps in this area.

Whole world is coming together to fight against marine threats and India has a chance to prove why a humongous ocean is named after her. Politically also it can benefit India as China is trying to maximize its influence in the Indian Ocean and with favorable marine policies India can lead South Asian countries in this mission of protecting marine life, and thus creating a limitless influence in the Indian ocean. India also needs to create a safer Sustainable coastal environment to boost tourism. Even

though India has a larger coastline than Thailand, still Thailand is able to grab more tourists than India annually. Recent developments at the central level proved favorable in creating a sustainable tourism sector. Flagship projects like Swatch Bharat Abhiyan and NamamiGange got big recognitions. Sagarmala project or the Blue Revolution is working towards improving the state of India's ports and coastlines. A National Plan for the conservation of aquatic eco-systems was framed to conserve marine ecosystems. Union ministry is working on a comprehensive study to find out the source of litter that flows into seas. A national-level Oil spill disaster contingency plan was released by the Indian coast guard intended towards preservation of oceans from oil spills. India has also set up its own Rs 100 crores valued 'Automated Ocean Pollution Observation System' that provides real-time data of the water quality across Indian coasts. The world united when Amazons burnt, but why less for oceans? Oceans yet have much more to explore but we have to do something otherwise the glory of marine life will end before their exploration.
